

WHAT IS DISCARDISCO?

DiscarDisco is a sustainable sartorial soiree, a detritus dance party, and a conscientious community event featuring a live runway show, dancing, crafting, silent auction and raffle. This fabulous fashion show competition is The WasteShed's major annual fundraiser. DiscarDisco showcases the wearable post-consumer creations by artists and designers from Chicagoland area. Contestant designers design and create their runway looks made from Designer Mystery Boxes - a box of randomized fabric, notions and bits sourced from The WasteShed's stores. Designers share their process with each other, consult our expert partners at AIBI (Apparel Industry Board, Inc, a nonprofit that provides resources and support to Chicago-based apparel designers), and document their final product.

AIBI is a non-profit organization specifically dedicated to the needs of the sewn products industry. AIBI is comprised of the major players in Greater Chicago, whose careers and business expertise span all facets of the industry, to nurture and support designers based in Greater Chicago. AIBI is constantly developing new programs to better serve and promote the industry as a whole.

ABOUT IT THE WASTESHED

The WasteShed provides Chicago with an affordable resource for repurposed arts, crafts and school materials. While sustainability is the ultimate goal, creative reuse emphasizes fun, hands-on activities as points of entry into larger discussions about the things we own and the way we live. Since opening in 2014, The WasteShed has diverted over 168 tons of donated materials away from the landfill and back into the community, with an estimated value of \$3.4 million. Teachers from over 400 schools in the Chicagoland area rely on the store for materials, receiving over \$12,000 of free supplies in 2023. The nonprofit expanded to a second location in Evanston, IL in 2021 to meet demand.

At The Wasteshed, we believe in the power of creativity to transform waste into valuable resources. From fabric scraps and paintbrushes to school supplies, we offer a diverse range of items that inspire our community to think differently about consumption and waste. Our impact extends beyond just providing materials; through workshops, classes, and community events, we empower individuals to develop new skills and foster a culture of sustainability and exploration.
